

Faculty Offered Travel Grants

The Inter-University Committee on Travel Grants announces opportunities for advanced graduate students, faculty members, and post-doctoral researchers to engage in study and research in the Soviet Union, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, and Hungary during the academic year, 1967-68.

These exchanges are made possible by the intergovernmental agreement on exchanges with the USSR and agreements with the respective educational organizations in Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, and Hungary.

They are administered by the Inter-University Committee on Travel Grants, a multi-university American organization whose objective is to strengthen American education.

The Inter-University Committee administers three separate exchanges with the USSR: an exchange of advanced graduate students and young faculty, an exchange of post-doctoral researchers, and an exchange of American teachers of Russian for a special ten-week program during the summer.

Participants in these exchanges are chosen in national competition through application and interview. Participants must have

Flemming's Views on Draft...

He added that there are four alternatives to the present draft situation: a national lottery, improving and refining the present system, abandoning the draft altogether and relying completely on voluntary conscription, and the idea of a universal national service, which, Flemming said, "fascinates me."

"The direction the draft will take depends very largely on what will happen in Viet Nam," he said, concluding discussion on that topic and looking around the room for other raised hands.

The subjects raised by the students attending the banquet were many and varied.

Flemming was asked about the possibility of liberalizing women's closing hours to midnight during the week and until 2 a.m. on weekends.

This proposal grew out of Panhellenic's request to the Conduct Committee to extend hours until 11:30 p.m. on week nights.

The Committee said since this would affect women living in

dorms and co-ops, they must be consulted before the decision could be made. Asked if they agreed on the extended hours, all but five students present said they did.

Flemming said that no decision has been made yet on student seating arrangements in the new football stadium.

"As soon as the facts are available I'll present them to the student body representatives and the ASUO Senate to hear their views," he said.

Another question raised concerned the possibility of having

the grading system changed from letter grades to a complete pass-non-pass system.

Flemming said he wasn't too optimistic of the chances for a total switch-over but that "many faculty members are willing and interested to work in that direction."
