Dave Anderson and Robert Corso tied for third in oratory.

Corso ranked third in interpretive reading at the two-day meet.

Nineteen colleges and universities competed in the Lewis and Clark tournament.

The University will be the defending champion this weekend at the Centralia College speech tournament in Centralia, Washington. The University has won the tournament's sweepstakes trophy for the past three years.
