

Mix-up Costs Oregon Homecoming Win

It could have been a glorious bowing out for Oregon's 47-year-old Hayward field Saturday. Nothing would have been more fitting than to have the Ducks score a last second come-from-behind homecoming victory in the stadium final grid contest.

And it might have happened in such story-book fashion if Oregon, trailing 14-3, hadn't lost track of the downs with ten seconds left and the ball on the Washington State's two yard line.

But with the down mix-up went the ball game on fourth down and in the midst of confusion. Oregon quarterback Mike Barnes threw out of bounds to stop the clock on what he and a lot of others thought was third down.

Oregon head coach Len Casanova put it simply.

"We blew it," he said, with his head in his hands. "I'm not blaming Barnes; I'm taking the blame myself. Or maybe I should take half the blame and give the officials the other half."

"I looked at the scoreboard (which still showed third down) and lost track of the downs," Cas explained.

According to Barnes the sideline marker also showed third down.

"Actually I thought it was third down," he said. "We lined up real fast and I checked the field marker thinking it would be correct." It must have changed as the ball was snapped.

Barnes also said he didn't see the official give fourth down sign.

The confusion began after the Ducks had made a first down on the WSU 11 yard line with 44 seconds left. At this point, Cas said, they were concentrating on getting field goal position, but on the next play Jones plowed up the middle for nine yards to the two.

Both Cas and Barnes assumed Jones' run was a first down and the Ducks decided to use up one play going for the touchdown.

"From where I was it looked like Jones had run nearly fifteen yards," Barnes said.

After throwing out of bounds to stop the clock Barnes went for the touchdown with a keeper to the left which went for no gain. "We were trying to score since we were so close and that play had been good for short yardage all day."

The fourth down out of bounds pass followed.

"I was counting the downs," Washington State head coach Bert Clark sighed after the game as he praised his team which had been trounced by Oregon State the previous weekend.

"They approached this game with a great mental attitude and that's about 90 per cent of the game," Clark said.

He added that his team had about the same attitude for the OSU game but that his defense was unsure of its maneuvers.

"I'm real proud," he said. "Today we had the defense set."

Clark also had praise for Oregon's comeback.

"They made a good halftime adjustment and they made some great catches," he said.

The Ducks, behind 14-7 at halftime, completely dominated the second half, outrushing the Cougars 98-28 and outpassing them 102-2.

"It was a good comeback," Cas grimaced, "but not enough."

But Mike Barnes when asked about the comeback, echoed the spirit the Ducks have shown all year despite a series of setbacks that could easily injure a teams' confidence.

"This is the kind of team that can do it and that's the sign of a good team, which I think we are."

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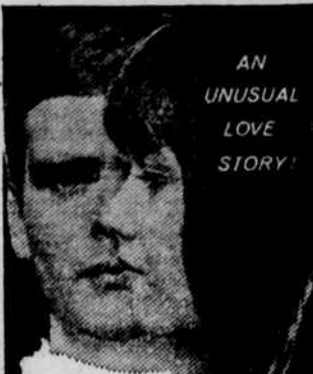
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IM Schedule
