Cabaret entertainment, a Kuwaiti desert war dance, an Arabian dinner and a speech by the Ambassador of Kuwait will all be a part of a "Night of Sheherazade" at 7:30 p.m. today in the Student Union.

The program, meant to familiarize Americans with some of Arab culture, is sponsored by the Arab Student Association, composed of 35 Arab students at the University from eight countries in the middle east and North Africa.

"Queen Sheherazade" will be

selected by a panel of judges from the five finalists: Sara Kingan, Margie Burke, Sue Elmgren, Marion Benton, and Sandy Engstrom. Eugene Mayor Edwin Cone will be among the judges. Talat Al-Ghoussen, ambassador

of Kuwait, will give a speech at the affair. He is scheduled to arrive at Mahlon Sweet Airport at 2:45 p.m. today.

Another special feature of the evening will be performances of an Arabian night-club troupe

from the Bagdad Cabaret in San Francisco.

The dinner will be prepared under the direction of the Arab student wives and women Arab students.

Tickets for the dinner have been completely sold out according to Bill Sanford, SU operations manager.

Nearly \$1,500 has been budgeted for this first annual program. Funds are from the campus and national Arab student associations and nine merchants and firms in the Eugene area.

ASUO Planning Asks For Student Parking

Contrary to the University Planning Committee report, the ASUO Planning Committee believes there is a parking problem on campus. In a meeting Tuesday, the committee stated that they want 307 extra parking spaces for students.

At the Senate meeting Thursday, the committee will make two recommendations. The committee wants the Hamilton lot on the east side of campus to be limited to student parking only, and they are recommending that students be allowed to park their cars on the parking lot on 17th and Alder. This lot is presently closed to students.

According to several members of the committee, the student parking lot on Columbia street is too far away from classrooms, such as those in Commonwealth.

It was noted that there is not enough student parking on the west side of campus. Students are forced to park along the streets, causing complaints by Eugene residents.

It was also pointed out that the faculty does not fill up several faculty parking lots that are far from classrooms and that this space could be used by students.

Student complaints of lack of parking space was also mentioned. It was pointed out that there have been over 3,000 parking tickets given by campus police alone since the beginning of fall term.

A bill proposing the opening

of the architecture library on Sunday with opening hours the same as the main library will be introduced.

A bill condemning the site of the computer center that is being built will also be introduced.
