To summarize these objections in one sentence, it is the considered opinion of the Erb Memorial Student Union Board that the proposed revision in the relationship of the Student Union Board to the University president is not in the best long-range interests of the University, student government, or in particular, the Student Union Board and its related committees.

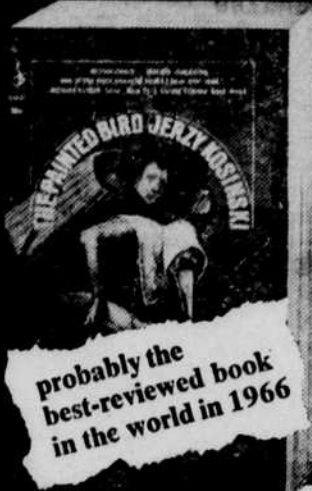
The Pioneer Program, instituted by the Central Lane YW-YMCA and the University Inter-Fraternity Council, attempts to provide male identification to children from families without fathers.

This has become an increasingly important problem as many fathers are being lost either temporarily or permanently to the Viet Nam war.

Supplying a male influence is done through group activity supervised by serious college students. Though the program cannot replace a missing parent, it tries to stimulate a frequent, healthy atmosphere around group activities and male contact.

Young men are the primary need of the program, though women are also asked to co-operate by planning activities.
