

Speech Team Faces Big Test

Ten University students will compete with 500 other students from 13 western states at the Western States Speech Tournament on the University of Washington campus in Seattle, Thursday through Saturday.

Coach W. Scott Nobles, associate professor of speech, will accompany his forensics team.

The Western States tournament

is one of the outstanding meets in the nation.

University debate teams will be entered in each division of debate at the three-day meet. The debaters include the team of Gary Roberts and Gregory Mowe, and the mixed team of Stephen McLaughlin and Susan Tugate, senior men.

Sue Miller and Laura Griffith, senior women; David Anderson and John Eads, junior men; and Rebecca Nobles and Starla Banta, junior women.

Each student will also enter two of the tournament's four individual speaking events—extemporaneous speaking, persuasive speaking, expository speaking, and oral interpretation.

Moore Will Lecture Today

Charles W. Moore, architect, teacher, and writer, and chairman of the Yale University Department of Architecture, will give a public lecture at the University at 8 p.m. today. It will be held in 138 Commonwealth.

Moore's topic will be, "The Graduated Inside."

He will be a guest of the Oregon School of Architecture and Allied Arts on two days, today and Thursday, December 1, and will serve as a member of the jury for the American Institute of Architects regional awards program November 29 through December 1.



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Speaker Victim Of Assassination

The assassination of Robert E. Moran in Guatemala as reported Thursday, is of particular significance at the University.

Moran was to have lectured and presented a film on the Dominican Republic, as a part of the World Around Us film-lecture series, sponsored by the Student Union Board.

Earlier in November, when Moran was reported missing in Guatemala, Jack Currey, a close associate of the missing man, was selected as a possible lecturer. He will now be scheduled to present the film, according to Student officials.

Currey is currently in the Dominican Republic, filming more recent scenes that will be presented in the November 29 program at 8 p.m. in the SU.
