

PE Grade Rules Established

Three basic guidelines for the collection of data for the three-year study of pass, no-pass physical education service courses have been adopted by the Bureau of Educational Research, according to research assistant Vincent Gallo.

The guidelines are as follows:

- Students who have not filled out choice cards shall be considered as desiring a "graded" preference for PE service courses 180, 190, 380, and 390.
- Students who have transferred from one service course to another must make out a second choice card corresponding to the new course.
- Students who have failed to make out a second choice card must do so immediately in 234 French. The choice must be identical to the original choice made on the dropped course.
