

China Program Dates Finalized

Time and dates for the International Education Center's China Conference, which will send University students overseas to study world opinion about U.S. policy toward Red China, have been finalized by the program's directors.

The travel program, postponed until spring due to problems in arrangements, will be held from April 3 to May 12.

The conference, in which participants will deliver a report on their findings to the student body, will be held May 24 and 25.

Seminar Course

Students who have applied for the program will enroll in a 405 or 407 seminar-type course at the beginning of winter term, which will give them background needed for the trip.

Applications for the program

will be accepted until January 13, according to Bill Allen, program director. Applicants also have until January 13 to sign up for the seminars. Further information about the seminars may be obtained from Allen at ext. 1836.

Cover Policy History

The course will cover U.S. policy toward Red China, the history of our Chinese policy, and Chinese policy toward the U.S., a review of opinions about the present stalemate in relations between the two countries, and background in polling methods to help the participants in doing research for the conference.

The participants, to be announced on February 1, will undergo two weeks of further intensive study before the program begins.

Confab Seeks End To 2-S Deferments

CHICAGO — A national draft conference agreed Wednesday that a major overhaul of the nation's draft system — including elimination of the student deferment—is necessary.

Among several conclusions reached in a loudly-applauded summary report delivered at the conference Wednesday were requests for two changes:

- Elimination of student and occupational deferments, and
- Tightened control over local boards, to eliminate inequities.

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
