

Returned Peace Corps Trio to Sponsor Films

Married students and Eugene residents should be especially interested in the arrival of three Peace Corps representatives who will visit the University campus next week. The recruiters are Chris and Kay Byers, a husband-and-wife team who have done community development work in Chimbote and Lima, Peru, for the past two years, and former ASUO vice-president Jim Cloutier, who has served in Kenya with the Kenya Department of Settlement.

The trio will be stationed on the Student Union Terrace every day next week, April 24-28. They will be sponsoring a Peace Corps film, "One Step at a Time," to be shown Tuesday night at 7:30 p.m.

In addition, Cloutier and members of the local Peace Corps Action Committee, a group of local returned volunteers, will be presenting slide shows they took themselves in their host coun-

tries each noon hour in the Student Union. A different country will be scheduled each day beginning with Cloutier's slides on Kenya Monday; Lee Harlan on Peru Tuesday; and Larry Leamur on Nepal Wednesday.

Cloutier, who did much audiovisual work for the Settlement Department while in Kenya, will also display photographs and various artifacts in the Taylor Lounge during the week.

The Peace Corps Modern Language Aptitude Test, approximately one half hour in length, will be given for Peace Corps applicants several times a day starting Tuesday. Applicants should register for their test at the recruiting table and bring their completed questionnaire with them to the test unless they have already sent one to Washington, D.C. Applications will be accepted for assignments starting this summer.

Friends Plan For Home Tour

A special exhibition of photographs, floor plans, garden plans, interior plans, and scale models of the homes featured in the Architectural Home Tour will open at the University Museum of Art today, from 1-5 p.m.

The purpose of the display is to stimulate interest in the Home Tour, planned for Sunday, May 7, by the Friends of the Museum. The Women's Architectural League is assisting with the tour.

Maps for the May 7 tour will be provided for all those driving their own cars. The tour lasts approximately three hours, and participants are advised to wear walking shoes which can be transferred to slippers at the door of each house toured.

An open house will be held at the Museum of Art from 1-6 p.m. on the day of the tour to enable participants to meet the homeowners, architects, landscape architects, and interior designers.

Cost of tickets for the tour will be \$5 per couple, \$3.50 for a single admission, and \$2 per student. They will be available at Reed and Cross, Bon Marche, Kaufman's in Springfield, Lloyd Home Trends and the Museum of Art.

An additional \$1 will be charged for each ticket-holder wanting to travel by bus, available to a limited number on a first come basis. Buses will be loading at 14th and Kincaid University parking lot at 12:45 p.m. and 1:45 p.m.

The proceeds from the ticket sales will go toward the expansion of statewide services provided by the Friends of the Museum.
