tive assistant; Richard Trombley, flute, assistant professor of music.

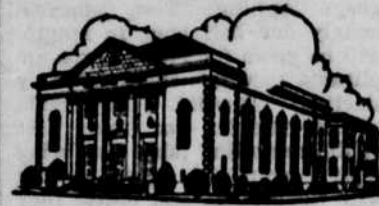
