Underground Film to Run

An underground film, "Keep Off the Grass," will be the central feature of the Ecumenical Worship Service at 11 a.m. Sunday at the Wesley Foundation, 1236 Kincaid.

Ronald Finne will make his witness via his film. This particular film was selected as part of a SEARCH course last term which studied underground film technique. Earlier it was entered in the Eugene "Image-

makers' Festival." Since this time sound has been added to the production.

Finne received his B.A. from Reed College and his M.A. in Sociology from the University. Some of his films were made while he worked in the poverty program in Eugene previous to his present employment with the political science department of the University.

"This is one of the very few places in the entire state where the participants actually have a hand in the worship service," commented Rev. Robert Peters of the Wesley Foundation.

Rev. Peters explained that the Sunday service is sponsored by the Cooperative Christian Ministry and involves participants from various religious backgrounds. Each service is planned by a student committee of 19 with 2 professional advisors.

"Our services are never the same," said Rev. Peters, "and

we enjoy the freedom we have to experiment. Yet, we must always remember we are responsible to the Christian faith."
