

Chinese Refugee Speaks Today

Dr. Edward Shook, a refugee from Communist China, will speak at 4 today in the EMU.

Now on the staff at the University of California at Berkeley, Shook is a medical doctor whose work in radiology has brought him mention in "Who's Who in American Medicine" and "Who's Who in American Education."

Shook will speak from experiences in Communism in China. He was born in Shanghai in 1937 and fled the mainland in 1958. He lived for a time in Formosa, serving as a translator and information worker from the Nationalist regime.

Shook's appearance is sponsored by the University Young Americans for Freedom and the National Student Committee for a Free China.
