A steel band, made up of Howard students from the Caribbean area, gave a performance Friday night that led one radio correspondent to announce, almost ecstatically, that "even some of these middle-aged newsmen out here can hardly keep still, with that music in the background."

Saturday the students said they had agreed to accept the settlement proposed by the Board of Trustees. By Saturday evening the students had cleared all of their belongings, including mattresses, and other bedding materials, out of the administration building.
