lems which have so greatly absorbed the creative energy of all our people," Allman said.

"The second thing is that Gene McCarthy's campaign to take his position to the American people has been enthusiastically received. The present administration can no longer ignore the momentum of this campaign," he added.

Norman Stoll, a Portland attorney who was heading the Johnson campaign here, said in reaction to the President's statement, "This proves that the President is a great American and is dedicated to the pursuit of peace."

He added that Johnson, by removing himself from the political arena, has also refuted the accusations of political expediency which his opponents have claimed.

Stoll said that he "knew President Johnson intended to seek re-election. It must have been an agonizing decision to make, but the President had the courage and wisdom to make it."
