The list of all degree candidates for the June 9 Graduation Convocation is now being compiled by the Registrar's Office. Last day to file an Application for Degree is May 10. This date will be enforced because of the many operations of checking, clearing, and printing which must follow.

To qualify for the degree applied for, a student must have completed all necessary work and procedures by the end of spring term. All transcripts from other schools must have been on file and all current University work finished not later than June 7, 1968.

Any student who has applied previously and did not receive the degree must reapply. Likewise, any student who does not meet the above deadlines must reapply for a future date.
