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trative structure. Before, it was outside the University, something to hide. Now we have become the advocates of Upward Bound."

The new structuring will mean improvements in both the selection and education of Upward Bound students. "There are a lot more people to do the choosing now," said John Warfield. "There are myself, the assistant director, former Upward Bound students, and the entire executive committee."

"Now we can get definite commitments as to curriculum, graduate student help, and innovations in curriculum," Mohr

said. "We can ask ourselves the question: 'How can we change the curriculum to get more across.' Instead of teaching White middle-class values, we can teach material in a more relevant, meaningful way."

"The University doesn't mean anything to any of these kids," Mohr continued. "They're faced with a strange and totally new experience."

Klonoski said the endorsement from the political science department would help improve education because majors in political science would be given credit for projects involving Upward Bound students.

"Perhaps political science

graduates can engage in research to see what kind of progress these students are making and seniors in political science can get credit for teaching freshman courses," Klonoski said.

"We anticipate that other departments will help out," he said. "I think the program belongs here because the University has a major responsibility for the condition of society."

"What we see all around us, this disintegration of society, is a direct result of the problem of disadvantaged, underprivileged minority groups."

"The University brings the analytical mind to the problem of the disadvantaged," Warfield remarked. "No institution can afford the luxury of abrogating that responsibility."

ASUO Announces Student Exchange

The ASUO has established a Student Government Exchange Program with Chile according to ASUO Vice President Dan Allison.

A University student will be sent to Chile this summer, and a Chilean student will come to the University fall term, 1969.

The purpose of the program is to exchange information between universities of foreign nations regarding student governments.

Petitions are now open for a representative of University student government to serve for one month as an intern to the student government of a major Chilean university and an additional month as an ambassador for the Experiment in International Living, according to Allison.

Petitions are open to any University student wishing to apply; two years of Spanish by the applicant is suggested. Applications may be picked up in the IEC office, Room 318 EMU.

Theatre Presents Cocteau Drama

Jean Cocteau's controversial drama, "Intimate Relations," which created an unprecedented scandal when first performed in 1938, will be presented at the University Pocket Playhouse on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, May 10-12.

Cocteau's play concerns a devouring mother who kills herself because her love for her son turns her husband toward a mistress who happens to be the son's fiancée. Cocteau labels the work "drama which is a comedy whose fundamentals are those of vaudeville."

Gwen Jackson and Fred Patle are cast in the roles of the mother and father, with Jean Tolenaar, Gloria Smith, and Richard Wright rounding out the cast.

Friday and Saturday performances will be at 8 p.m., with the Sunday matinee performance scheduled for 3 p.m. Tickets for

all three showings go on sale today at the University Theatre box office.
