Service Stressed By IFC President

University fraternities should direct their initiative away from "hell week" toward community service, Inter-Fraternity Council President Chris Mullman told an audience of about 350 rushees in McArthur Court Thursday night.

In a brief speech Mullman warned the audience composed of freshman that fraternities would wither away if they weren't relevant. He said the fraternity system could no longer be strictly a social system or dating service.

The IFC President also told the rushees the future of the fraternity system at the University depended more on them than on him as the president.

Dean of Students Donald Dushane and Assistant Dean of Men John English also spoke briefly to the group.

Formal rush for IFC will begin Thursday evening and will continue through Sunday.
