It could very well be that no one will win the racial confrontation which appears to be shaping up. Equally important, the United States of America could cease to exist as a nation. However, Black America has come too far, suffered too long to allow a "business as usual" approach toward solving important social problems—White racism being the central one at this point.

White racism not only distorts the interaction process between Black people and White people, but also pollutes every other sphere of our body politic. Whites cannot relate to other Whites because of the perverse atmosphere caused by the social disease of White racism. Black people are unable to communicate with each other because many are still playing the role of "parrot," while still others are engaging in empty rhetoric. The type of rhetoric that we speak of is designed to gather crowds, to indulge in revolutionary phrase mongering void of content or program. The Black community, we strongly suggest, cannot afford to further engage in such "luxuries." We are quite simply in a fight for physical as well as spiritual survival and such a struggle does not allow for game playing.

Our country has the potential for being the richest country on the face of the globe. By richest, we mean in the broadest sense of that term—economically, politely and socially strong. And yet, vital human resources, i.e., human talents, are being criminally wasted because of White racism. Quite literally then, Black Power is in the interest of White as well as Black Americans because it genuinely frees both.
