about to be dragged down to the ground, he flipped the ball back to Jones. Split end Greg Sprech blocked the only Rook between Jones and the goal line — 93 yards away.

Drake failed to run the ball into the end zone for the PAT when the center snap was fumbled. Score: 13-0.

Sock! With about six minutes left in the first half Greg Brosterhaus stepped back to punt for the Frosh with a fourth and two situation on the Rook 49. After he got the kick off he was hit by three Rooks — a roughing the kicker penalty.

Oregon took over on the OSU 34. A pitchout to Jones resulted in an eight yard loss, so Winn again took the snap from center, stepped back, and hit Moore straight over the middle with a 42 yard TD bomb.

The two point conversion attempt failed. Score: 19-0.

Bang! The score was still 19-0 with three and a half minutes left in the game when the Frosh took the ball over on their own 37, following three incomplete Endicott aerials. After three plays gained only nine yards, Winn did his routine; stepped back with the ball and flung it, this time 54 yards to Moore, who through some fine moves had his man beat by half a step, and scored his third touchdown of the day.

In probably the most humiliating play of the day for the Rooks, the Frosh decided to go again for the two point conversion.

Crunch! Seconds later Mike Doran kicked off for the Frosh to Oregon State's Jerry McBurney on the OSU 30, who was tackled immediately.

In two plays the Oregon defense had second string Rook quarterback Mike Tamiyasu back on his own one yard line. On the next play 280 pound Frank Bowlby — **CRUNCH** — fell on 5-10, 175 pound Tamiyasu in the end zone for a safety. Score: 29-0.
