In probably the most humiliating play of the day for the Rooks, the Frosh decided to go again for the two point conversion.

Crunch! Seconds later Mike Doran kicked off for the Frosh to Oregon State's Jerry Mc-Burney on the OSU 30, who was tackled immediately.

In two plays the Oregon de-fense had second string Rook quarterback Mike Tamiyasu back on his own one vard line On the next play 280 pound Frank Bowlby — CRUNCH — fell on 5-10, 175 pound Tamiyasu in the end zone for a safety. Score: 29-0.
