Senator Wages Sales Tax Fight

Sen. Vern Cook, Gresham, has called for the formation of a statewide organization to oppose adoption of Gov. Tom McCall's Republican Sales Tax Plan.

"McCall has made the most irresponsible, undemocratic and unpopular tax proposal ever made by a governor of Oregon," said Cook.

Cook explained, "the McCall referral proposal is irresponsible because it is the duty of the members of the legislature to adopt a tax program, not pass the buck to the people. If the people like the tax program, they can let it stand.

"If a substantial number of the people dislike the tax program they can refer it and vote on it at the next following general election . . . The only justification for a special tax election

would be an emergency that could not wait until the 1870 general election and no one has claimed that such an emergency exists," he concluded.

Cook has appealed to people opposing the sales tax, asking them to write to him in Gresham.
