

Mac Court roof causes closure

McArthur Court appeared to be the biggest worry today for Athletic Department officials and the physical plant. The wooden roof on the 42-year old structure is in danger of collapsing according to physical plant officials.

The roof is covered with the three-foot snowfall which buried Eugene over the weekend. According to James Henshaw, assistant director of the University physical plant, no one is clearing the covering because the physical plant does not want to risk the lives of its workers.

Neal Steinhauer in Invitational

PORTLAND (AP)—Neal Steinhauer, the former Oregon track star, has regained his form in the shot put and is the favorite to win the event at the Oregon Invitational track meet Feb. 1.

Steinhauer, now competing for the U.S. Army, suffered a crippling back injury which kept him out of the Olympic Games. George Woods, the bronze medal winner at the Olympics, is expected to be Steinhauer's main competition.

Six of the 10 entrants in the shot put have bettered the 60-foot mark.

The Amateur Athletic Union announced changes Thursday in the indoor schedule of Australian Ralph Doubell and Ron Clarke, but both will still run in the two-mile run in Portland, the AAU said. They are favorites in the event.

Eight Olympic gold medal winners are entered in the meet at Memorial Coliseum, including broad jumper Bob Beamon, who set the world record of 29 feet, 2 1/2 inches at the Olympic Games.

Dick Fosbury of Oregon State, who won the gold in the high jump, will bring his famed Fosbury Flop to Portland. Fosbury goes over the bar head first with his back to the bar.

Hartman sets record

A fantastic comeback performance by Dennis Hartman on the three-meter board powered Oregon to a 58-55 upset win over a talented UCLA swim squad Saturday in Leighton Pool.

Hartman was disappointing in the one-meter dives as he could manage only a third place in one of his specialties. But he got a reprieve in the three-meter event.

Oregon was trailing the Bruins 48-45 going into the three-meter competition and without a first place the Ducks had no chance to take the team title. Hartman gave his teammates that chance by turning four near-perfect dives into a new school and meet record.

Broke own record

He accumulated 309.05 points to easily outdistance Gordon Creed of UCLA who collected 244.75. Hartman's point total broke his own school mark of 300.95 set in 1966. The Denver, Colo. junior also established a new meet record because the two Pacific schools have never competed in three-meter diving before.

Hartman's first place set the stage for a "down to the wire" finish. The Webfoots closed the gap to 55-51 and then won the final event, the 400-yard freestyle relay, by a close .4 of a second to claim the well-deserved win.

Bob Jensen proved to be another great asset to Coach Don Van Rossen's Duck swim team by posting victories in the 50- and 100-yard freestyles and swimming the anchor leg in the crucial 400 freestyle relay.

Other Webfoot firsts came from sophomore Jerry Newman in the 200 individual medley and Mike Beauchamp in the 200 backstroke.

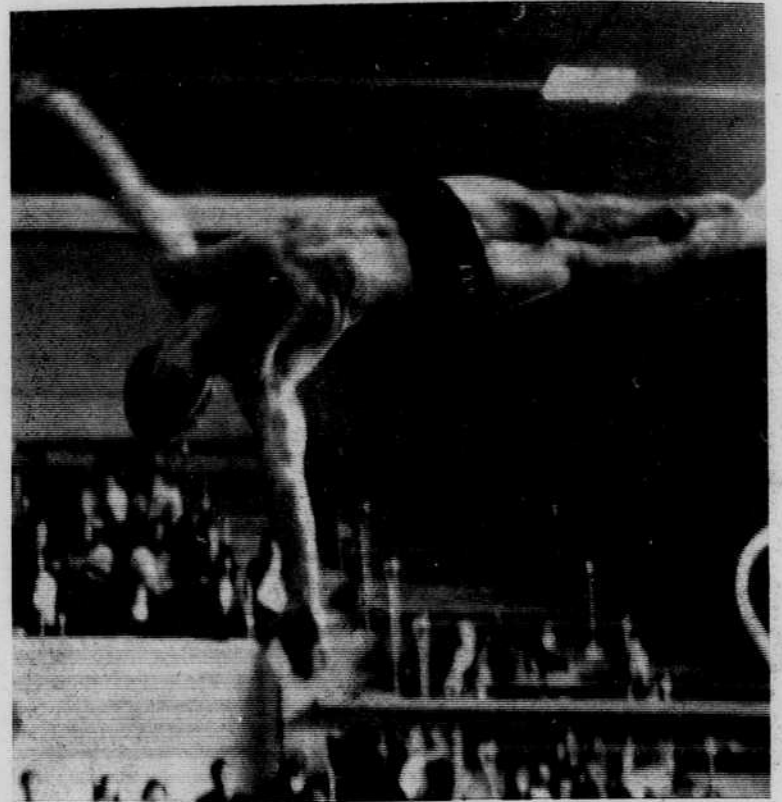
Qualifys for NCAA

Beauchamp's 2:02.9 time in the backstroke event qualified him for the NCAA meet at Bloomington, Ind. in late March. The former high school All-American qualified in the 100-yard backstroke earlier in the year.

His clocking also set a new varsity record, wiping out the old standard of 2:04.3 set by Julian Carroll in 1965.

Van Rossen was naturally a very happy man following Oregon's victory in the final event. After getting thrown in the pool along with diving coach Don Mc-

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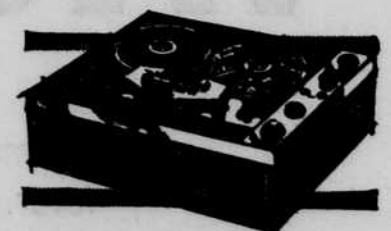
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
