

Honors won in tournament by University speech team

The University speech team captured honors in two forensics tournaments recently.

The University took sweepstakes honors in competition with 47 other schools last week at Linfield College in McMinnville.

The team also won first place in the Northwest Regional Qualifying Debate Tournament and, with teams from the University of Washington and Washington State, will represent this region at the National Debate Tournament in April at Dekalb, Illinois.

In the Linfield Tournament the University won both senior and grand sweepstakes prizes.

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Lewis and Clark took second in sweepstakes and the University of Utah, third.

The University debate team of Gary Roberts, senior in economics and John Eads, senior in political science, had a six wins-no loss record at the end of the round-robin tournament at Lewis and Clark College.

The University of Washington and Washington State debaters placed second and third, respectively, in competition with four wins and two losses apiece.

Other results at the Linfield Tournament were: John Eads

and Diane DePuy, first in Lincoln-Douglas Debate; Diane DePuy and Roxanne Merriss, first in Oxford Debate; Nancy Dixon, first in Original Poetry, and John Eads, first in Impromptu Speaking.

European trip offered to alumni

University alumni and their families will have the opportunity to vacation in Europe this summer via a special \$350 charter roundtrip airplane flight sponsored by the University Alumni Association.

The flight, on Pan American jet clipper, leaves Portland (or San Francisco, with an additional \$10 fare charge) on July 7, is polar routed, and lands in Paris on July 8. Meals and bar service will be provided during flight.

During the 28-day stay in Europe, the passenger is free to sightsee on his own or join special tours. The alumni association has detailed information on a number of package tours in Europe that will cover some 10 or more countries.

Reservations must be made through the University Alumni Association before April 1. A \$50 deposit, payable to the Alumni Association, is required with each reservation.
