

Faculty vote representation argued by SAB members

Voting faculty representation on the Student Administrative Board (SAB) was closely contested in the SAB meeting Thursday in the EMU.

The motion failed. An effort to reconsider next week resulted in a four yes, four no, with one abstention. SAB chairman Steve Rhodes voted against reconsideration to break the tie.

SAB member Gunnar Lundeberg moved to strike the clause in the SAB's constitution which provides for two voting faculty members, appointed by the University president, on the 16-member board.

"The faculty is out of place as voting members on this board. Everything we do is directly related to students. It doesn't affect the faculty at all," Lundeberg began.

Rex Armstrong disagreed. "We run the EMU. And student organizations have faculty and community members."

This is the exact power of the SAB — policy-making for the EMU and jurisdiction over all student organizations.

Lundeberg added that the ASUO Senate also makes decisions which affect more persons than students. The Senate is entirely composed of students.

SAB Chairman Steve Rhodes mentioned an idea proposed by Bob Winger that the Senate be replaced by a governing body of equal numbers of students and faculty members.

The SAB also covered several other items of business. The board approved the venue for SAB policy, with the exception of the wording in one phrase. The section reworded dealt with what happens when the ASUO Senate or president veto an SAB policy.

The version approved earlier by the Senate provided that a three-fourths SAB majority could "appeal" to the ASUO president to ask the University president for a final decision.

Rhodes said both he and ASUO President Dick Jones disliked that wording, since the ASUO president could ignore the SAB appeal.

On board member Jeri Coney's suggestion, the SAB changed the wording to "then the ASUO president shall request the University president to reach a final decision" to insure the follow-through of the appeal.

The SAB gave only cursory attention to an open letter from a student criticizing the board on some of its past actions and for anti-student attitudes.

But with the letter in mind, the SAB decided to open its

Rhodes also announced the hiring of three SAB members this term. Scott Armstrong was graduated, Caroline Greene resigned to student teach in Salem and Rose Noel is on leave of absence temporarily.
