Speech on international relations scheduled

Kenneth Terhune will speak today, at 3:30 p.m. in Room 341 Commonwealth on "An Approach to Understanding Interpersonal and International Relations."

Dr. Terhune is presently an associate professor in the Department of Psychology at Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts. His background experience includes such positions as research psychologist for Cornell Aeronautical Lab at Cornell University, psychology instructor at Princeton University, an engineer-psychologist-statistician for the Chrysler Corporation, and as an engineer for Chrysler Corporation.

His general research interest is in the study of cooperation and conflict with special attention to psychology of international relations. Dr. Terhune's talk is sponsored by the Department of Psychology, CSPA, and the Oregon Research Institute.

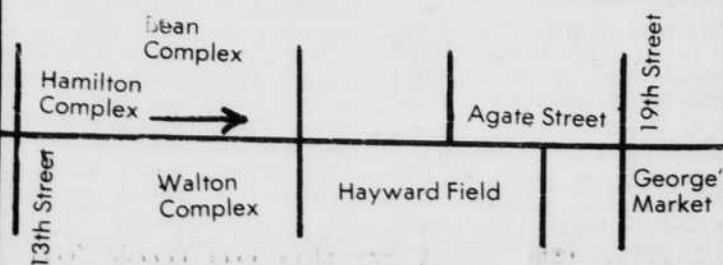

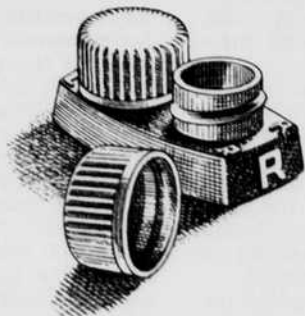
