Golfers set for Fresno

Oregon's successful golf team will get into the thick of some very stiff competition this weekend when Jack Adler's Ducks perform in the two-day Fresno State College Golf Classic in Fresno, Calif., Friday and Saturday.

Oregon has won both the Banana Belt and its own invitational tournament thus far this spring. The Ducks won the Banana Belt affair by six strokes and the Oregon Invitational by 18.

In both tournaments, the Webfoots' Dave Glenz was the top individual, taking the Banana Belt title by five strokes and finishing in a five-way tie for the championship in the Oregon tourney. Teammate Craig Griswold also was part of the five-way tie with Glenz.

This week, Oregon will be involved in an eight team tournament at Fresno and five of the eight teams made the final cut of 15 teams in the NCAA championships last year.

In addition to Oregon, host Fresno State, UCLA, Stanford, defending champion Arizona State, Brigham Young, San Jose State and Cal State of Los Angeles will compete.

Adler's six-man team for the Fresno trip will come from the following players: Glenz, Griswold, Doug Roxburgh, Don Smith, Dave Miller, Jack Sheehan and Kim Wenger.

whole Oregon baseball team was in a batting slump.

Only three regulars were hitting over .250, and the team average was a miniscule .210, accounting for a large part of the squad's so-so 3-3 record.

But the Duck bats exploded Wednesday.

With rightfielder Bill "Duke" Lawrence leading the way with a homer, double and single, Oregon pounded five Portland State pitchers for 14 hits and scored an 8-5 triumph over the Vikings at Howe Field.

Oregon faces Seattle University at 8 p.m. tonight at Portland Civic Stadium in first round play of the three-day Don Kirsch Memorial Tournament. Alan Hardin, who threw a four-hit shutout over Eastern Oregon in his only previous mound appearance this year, will pitch for the Ducks.

Wednesday's game was nip-and-tuck most of the way. PSU remained within one run of the Ducks until Lawrence's two-run home run, high over the right field fence, put the game away in the sixth inning.

A fine relief performance by Rich Zeider saved the victory. Zeider, a senior righthander who didn't play last year after having serious control problems as a sophomore, came on in relief of starter John Masters with two outs in the fourth and gave up only three hits the rest of the way. Masters showed good form in the early innings, but was forced to the sidelines with an arm injury.

Oregon scored its first run against PSU on first inning singles by Earle Wicklund and Gary Nall and a double by Lawrence, then took the lead for good in the second when freshman Guy Krause led off with a homer. Wicklund batted in another second inning run with a single.

A two-run single by Greg Brosterhous gave Oregon a 5-2 edge after three, but Portland State tallied twice in the fourth. Mike Bubalo's run-scoring double put Oregon on top by two again.

In doubles action, the combination of Fernando and Anderson have been the most successful as they are 3-1 so far. No other doubles combination has produced a win yet for the Ducks.

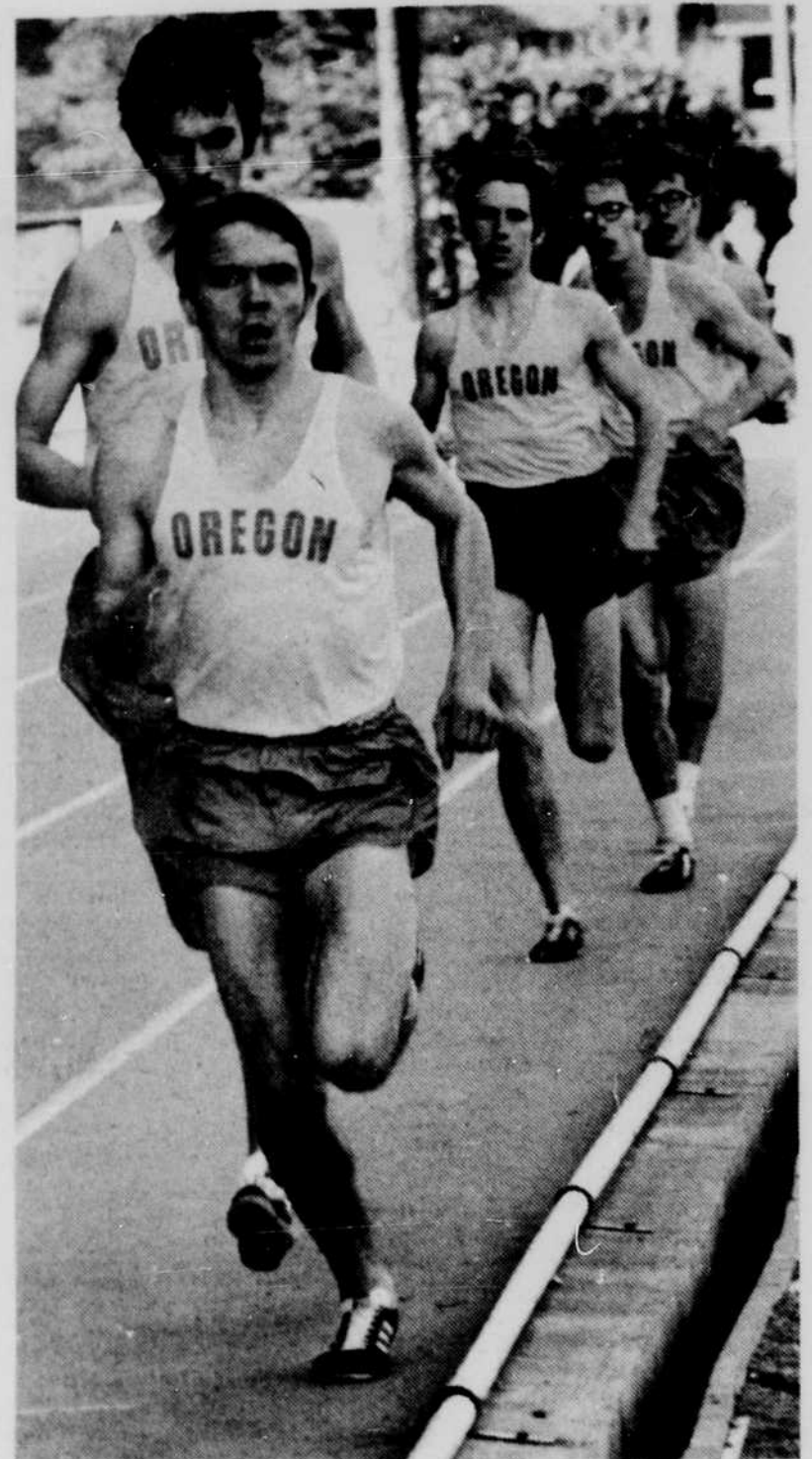
