Roller derby set April 23

One of the fastest growing spectator sports in the country is the Roller Derby, which will be making its first appearance in Eugene on Friday, April 23, at 8 p.m. in McArthur Court.

Perennial favorites, the San Francisco Bay Bombers are slated to roll against the top-rated Midwest Pioneers in this "live" action derby, which is sponsored by the University's Club Sports Program.

Leading the Bombers in action is Charlie O'Connell—"Mr. Roller Derby" to millions of fans. A 17-year veteran of the wheeled sport, O'Connell rated 1970's Most Valuable Player award. Margie Laszlo, twice voted the International Roller Derby League's Most Valuable Woman Player, heads the women's squad, along with Jan Vallow.

Tickets for the Derby are on sale at the Erb Memorial Union, Mattox Pipe Shop, Luby's Sport Center, and Penney's Valley River. Prices are \$3.50, \$3.00, \$2.50, and \$1.50.

Primates topic of lectures

British scientist Robert Hinde, leading authority on animal behavior, will give the 1971 Condon Lectures in Oregon on the development of social behavior in primates, April 7 and 8 at the University, April 12 and 13 at Oregon State University, and April 14 and 15 at Portland State University.

Condon Lectures, named for the first geology professor at the University, Thomas Condon, are sponsored every year by the State Board of Higher Education to bring results of recent scientific research to the public.

Hinde is a professor in the Department of Zoology at the University of Cambridge. He was made honorary director of the Medical Research Unit on Development of Integration of Behavior in 1970 and was the recipient of a Royal Society Research Professorship in 1963.

He will speak in 150 Science at the University; the Home Economics Auditorium on April 12 at Oregon State and Withycombe Auditorium on April 13 at OSU; and at Old Main Auditorium at Portland State University.

Each of his free public lectures will begin at 8 p.m.

Musical collage tonight at 8 p.m.

A musical-visual collage of sights and sounds of a "vanishing America" will be held tonight at 8 p.m. in the School of Music Recital Hall, as a scholarship benefit for students in drama, music and dance at the University.

The program, entitled "Innovations, Images and Sound," will feature Don Hunter, head of the audio-visual media center at the University.

The program is being sponsored by the Pi Delta chapter of Phi Beta, a women's fraternal organization devoted to speech, music and drama.

Tickets are priced at \$1.50 for adults, \$1 for students, and may be purchased from Phi Beta members or at the door.
