

Murder trial underway

The first degree murder trial of a former University student will begin at 10 this morning in Lane County Circuit Court.

Gaylord Sheridan Drew is one of three men charged in connection with the killing of a Eugene storekeeper during a robbery attempt last May. Drew is accused of shooting Fred Walter Fischer, owner of Eugene's Quinn's Market, on May 10, 1970.

Fischer was shot with a 12-gauge shotgun while in his store and died several hours later at Sacred Heart General Hospital. The men involved in the hold-up attempt apparently fled without taking any money.

The two other men charged in connection with the shooting are Jerome Preston Foster, also a former University student, and Billy Charles Anfield, Portland.

Drew's trial, which is expected to last two to three weeks, will be presided over by Circuit Court Judge Douglas Spencer.

The former University student is defended by Eugene attorneys Gary Jensen and James Strickland. Prosecuting the case will be Deputy Dist. Attys. John Moore and Fred Hartstrom.

Student delegates have been chosen on the basis of academic achievement and interest in foreign affairs.

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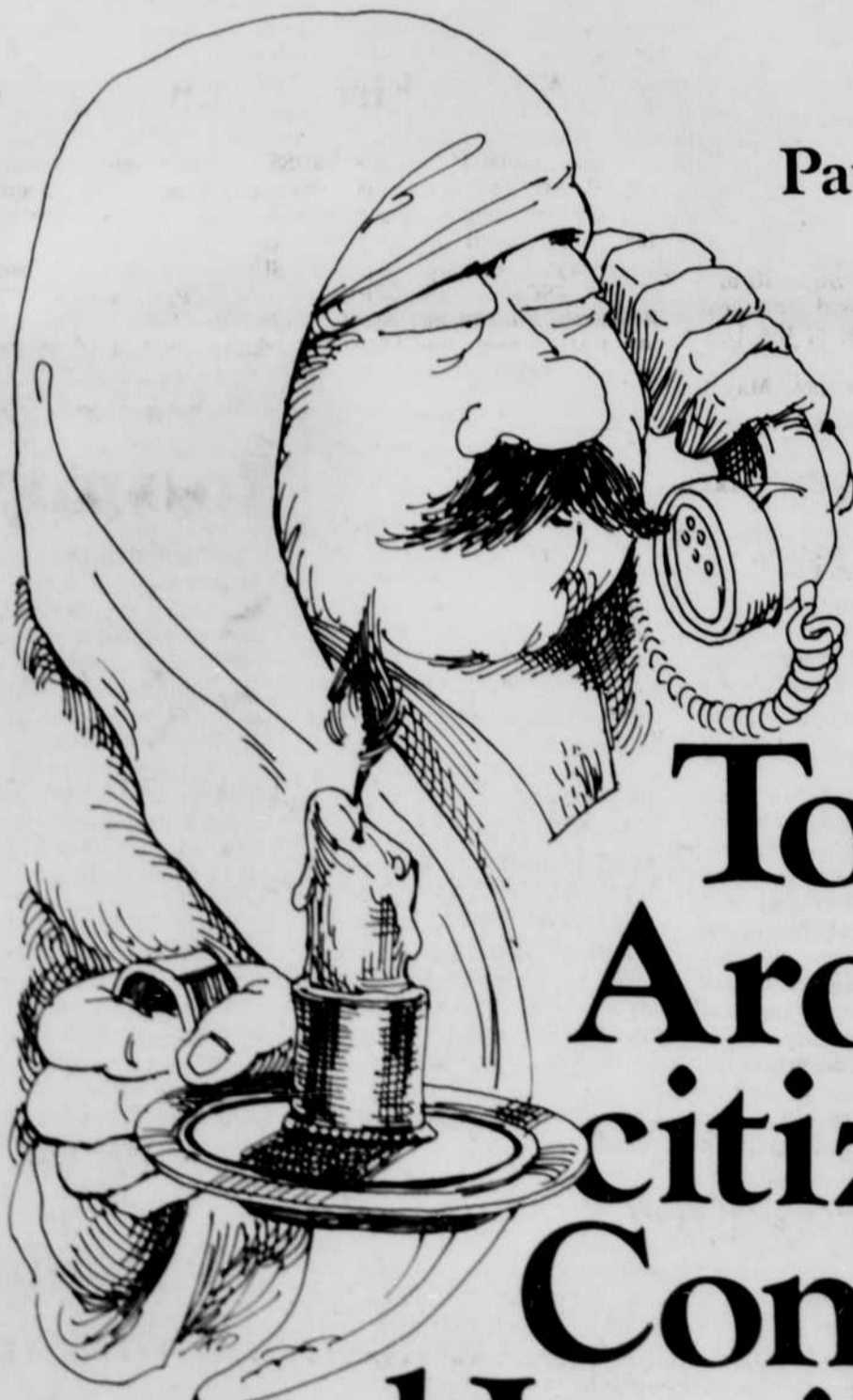


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
