# Student disc jockey suspended for airing song with drug lyrics

LOWELL, Mass. (CPS)—Student disc jockey Jack Leslie has been suspended from WLTI-FM by faculty advisor Martin Patt for airing "Hand of Doom," by Black Sabbath.

Patt, a professor of communications at Lowell Technological Institute, justified the suspension at the student station last month by referring to the March 5 Federal Communications Commission ruling notifying the nation's broadcasters that it is their responsibility to keep songs promoting or glorifying the use of drugs off the air.

Faculty advisor Patt deemed the song as supporting the use of drugs.

The Black Sabbath song chronicles a heroin addict's decline and impending death after being disillusioned by war. The lyrics say, "First it was the bomb... Vietnam, napalm... Disillusioning... You push the needle in... From that you escape."

The song ends: "It's too late to turn... You don't want to learn... Price of life you hide... Now you're gonna die."
