Low bids insure start of Science III

Acceptable bids were finally received for the University's third science edition Tuesday night, a project which has been in the planning stages for nine years.

First bids for the \$3.4 million project were received in November of 1969, but were rejected because they were above architects' estimates.

Low bids were \$1,179,450, Waldo S. Hardie & Son of Eugene, for general construction; \$779,883, Temp-Control Corporation of Portland and Eugene, for mechanical work; \$309,420, Linco Electric Company of Albany, for electrical work.
