Historian to speak

Jesse Lemisch, historian from Roosevelt University in Chicago, will give a public talk entitled "The Great White Men or the 'Inarticulate' Masses? How to Look at the American Revolution from the Bottom Up." Lemisch will speak at 7:30 tonight in the EMU.

A member of what some term the "New Left" tendency in historical study, Lemisch has played an active role in the New University Conference. He advocates the study of history "from the bottom up," focusing on the roles of the lower classes.

Lemisch is a student of the American Revolution and a member of the American Historical Association's committee on the American Revolution bicentennial observance.

His talk is being sponsored by the University department of history and is open to the public without charge.

Editor addresses confab

Eric Allen Jr., editor of the Medford Mail Tribune, will address advisors attending the 50th annual Oregon Scholastic Press Conference today in the EMU.

Allen's talk, "Why, Daddy?" is scheduled for 9 a.m., following the advisors' breakfast meeting. Allen is the son of the late Eric Allen, one-time dean of the School of Journalism and founder of the OSP in 1921.

The conference annually draws hundreds of high school journalists and advisors from around the state.

In addition to Allen, more than 50 professional journalists will lead seminars and discussions dealing with problems of the student press.

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
