# Some small colleges likely to perish

WASHINGTON (CPS) — Study by the Carnegie Commission on Higher Education has concluded that 494 small, obscure colleges with relaxed admission policies are the kind "most likely to become extinct."

American higher education may suffer a severe loss of its diversity," the report said, unless steps are taken to save some of them. The colleges enroll about 500,000 students and represent nearly one-fourth of the undergraduate colleges in this nation.

Seventy per cent of the schools have fewer than 1,000 students, 50 per cent have fewer than 750. The colleges are characterized as having unselective admission policies as reflected in their small enrollments and lower-than-average academic ability of their students. They include teacher's, black, Protestant, and Roman Catholic schools.

The report suggested that state and federal aid should be used to save some of them but stated that "institutions that are plainly incompetent...have no particular right to support or survival."

The report went on to say that these insitiuitions are "caught in a bind between the elite colleges, which are able to charge high tuition fees because of their popularity with prospective students and the public institutions which lack the prestige of the litte colleges but can attract students because of their very low fees."
