#### Tax plan on tap for City Council

Lane County's proposed "piggy-back" income tax plan will be one of the topics discussed at a public meeting of the Eugene City Council at noon today at the Eugene Hotel.

County officials contend that with the 11/2 per cent income tax suggested by the plan, and its provision that tax revenues be divided so that cities within the county receive 55 per cent of the money raised by the tax, the city of Eugene would receive \$2.3 million. The remaining 45 per cent of the revenue would go to the county.

#### Convicts arraigned on escape charges

Two convicts who had been participants in the Oregon State Penitentiary Project NewGate program at the University were arraigned in Lane County Circuit Court Monday on charges of escape.

Douglas Knapp and Garrette Wolfe were charged with illegally walking away from the program on Sept. 19. They were arrested by police and FBI agents in Grand Forks, N.D. on Oct. 6.
