### **Carlson** returns

# **6-11 center eligible to play**

Oregon Duck basketball fortunes took a turn upward Tuesday with the \_nnouncement that 6-11 center A Carlson will be eligible to play starting this weekend.

Carlson had been ineligible for the first nine games this season because of academic deficiencies. It was hoped he would play in the Far West Classic but a delay in getting one class varified prevented his participation.

The native of Garden Grove, Calif., saw limited action last season, playing behind all-time Ore on scoring leader Stan Love.

Carlson scored 12 points in eight games for a 1.5 scoring average. He also average 1.5 rebounds a game.

As a freshman, Carlson

averaged 15.3 points and hit 49 per cent from the floor.

At 6-11, the 210-pound junior is the largest basketball player in Oregon history.
