La Raza founder gives talk

Jose Angel Gutierrez, elected president of the Crystal City, Texas School Board in 1970 through the organized efforts of local Mexican Americans, will speak at 1 p.m. today in the EMU Ballroom.

His talk is being sponsored by the Chicano Student Union, and open to the public without charge.

Gutierrez is founder of the independent Chicano political movement known as La Raza Unida Party which worked for election, and is a former state chairman of MAYA (Mexican American Youth Association) in Texas.

According to Jose Garcia, Jr., Director of the UO Chicano Student Union, Gutierrez is coming to Oregon to help the state's 50,000 permanent Chicano residents organize a La Raza Unida Party.

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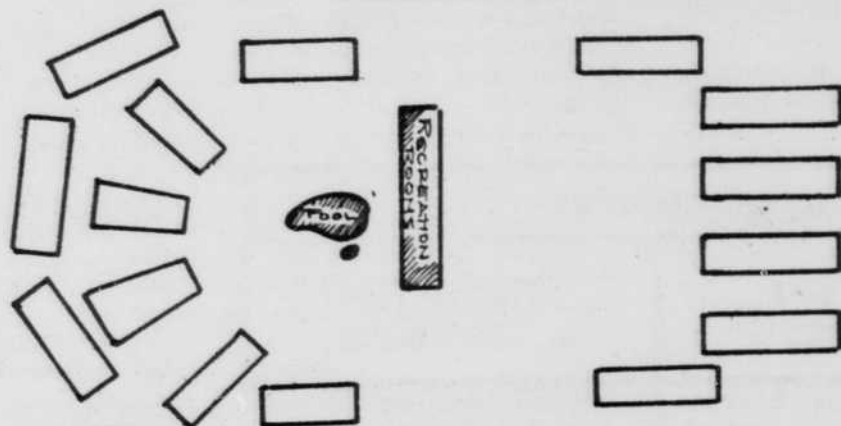
