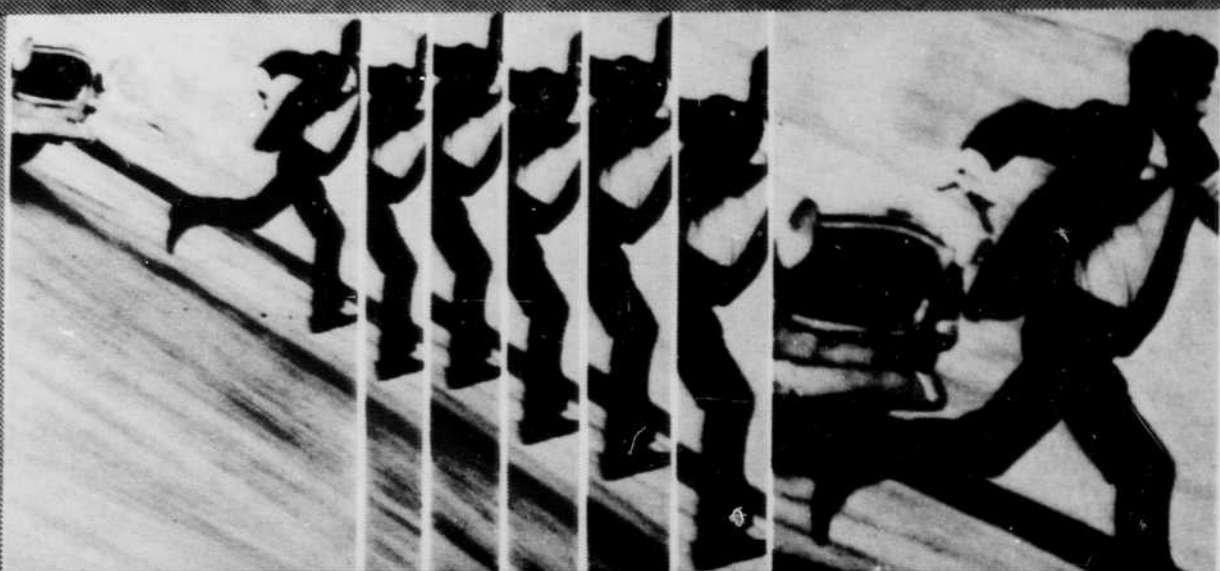

Patsy Mink to speak

Representative Patsy Mink will make a series of public appearances in a one day visit to Oregon on Wednesday in support of a citizens drive to place her name on the ballot in the May Oregon Democratic Primary as a Presidential candidate. The four term Congresswoman from Hawaii will speak to a noon DemoForum meeting at the Central Presbyterian Church in Eugene, sponsored by the Democratic Central Committee of Lane County. Her speech will be followed by a press conference at the church.

At 2 p.m., Rep. Mink will give an address at the University in the EMU Ballroom, under the auspices of the ASUO Cultural Forum.

Organ recital scheduled

Organist Lee Garrett will present a recital at the Central Presbyterian Church at 8 tonight. The recital will include a prelude and fugue by Buxtehude, three works by Bach and additional selections from Franck and Clerambault. Garrett, a candidate for the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the University is from Eugene. There is no admission charge for the recital.

Berrigan film to be shown

The International Program Committee presents "Father Dan Berrigan, The Holy Outlaw," a feature length film about the famous Jesuit priest who preached and acted against the Vietnam War. The film will be shown today at 1:30 p.m. in the EMU Ballroom and at 8 p.m. at Harris Hall at 8th and Oak, in front of the county courthouse. It will be shown tomorrow at 12:30 p.m. at LCC in Math 207, and at 8 p.m. at St. Alice's Church, 1520 F Street, Springfield.

Student involved in accident

A University student, Michael Thomas Leite, 21, 812 E. 14th Ave., Eugene, was reported in "fairly good" condition Saturday at Albany General Hospital after his car and a truck collided Friday night on Interstate 5 about 10 miles south of Albany.

The accident occurred about 11:45 p.m. Friday in the northbound lane of I-5. Leite's car struck the back of a trailer being towed by truck driver Donald Frank Bower, 49, of Portland, according to police. Bower was not injured.

Leite was treated for facial lacerations and various cuts and bruises and was being held overnight for observation. He was discharged Sunday.

Leite was cited on a charge of failing to maintain reasonable control of his vehicle.

Viet Vets to circulate

Oregon's Vietnam Veterans Against the War have announced plans to circulate a petition aimed at prohibiting men drafted in the state from serving in undeclared wars.

The group must collect 40,000 signatures in order to place the measure on the November ballot. Oregonians would then be enabled to express their views on the essence of a bill which passed the state senate last spring but was defeated in the lower chamber.

This announcement, and plans for another petition, were made following a state-regional meeting of the VVAW in Eugene Saturday.

Environmental document available

A copy of Portland General Electric Company's Trojan Nuclear Plant Environmental Report which was submitted to the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission on November 5, 1971, is available in the University Library. The report is located in the Oregon Collection on the second floor of the Library.

Included in the report are estimates of the impact of releasing liquid effluent containing radionuclides into the Columbia River, costs and benefits of the plant construction, and other information relevant to the purpose of the report.

Copies of the document have been given to selected libraries in order to satisfy public interest. The number of copies issued was not sufficient to meet individual requests.

The Trojan nuclear plant will be owned 30 percent by the Eugene Water and Electric Board, 67.5 percent by the Portland General Electric Company and 2.5 percent by the Pacific Power and Light Company.
