University preview scheduled

Oregon high school and community college students, interested parents, and counseling personnel are invited to the University on Saturday, Feb. 5, for a "preview" of the University.

The one-day special program has been designed to acquaint students with the offerings in the academic departments of the University, as well as give them information on the many aspects of student services, living opportunities, financial aid, and student government.

Special morning programs have been planned this year for parents. University President Robert Clark will speak at one session, with an opportunity provided for questions and answers. Vice President for Student Services Gerald Bogen will preside at a second session, with a panel of personnel from Student Services speaking on various aspects of the program.

Faculty to meet today

A motion to establish two faculty committees to deal with matters of promotion and tenure will be introduced at today's general faculty meeting, slated for 3:30 p.m. in 150 Science.

The motion will be introduced by Paul Civin, professor of mathematics and chairman of the President's Advisory Council.

Basically the motion provides for a professional school personnel committee and a liberal arts personnel committee. The committees would review tenure candidates and make recommendations to the Advisory Council, the body which helps President Robert Clark make the final decision on who gets tenured status.

(Tenure is the state of employment granted most faculty members between the third and fifth year in the state system. It provides for indefinite employment and protects teachers and some administrators against dismissal except for financial reasons or for "cause"—incompetence or misconduct.)

Civin's motion would basically consolidate the preliminary investigation that occurs in tenure cases into one body. Presently, the department head—or in some of the larger departments, schools and colleges, a tenure committee—does the review. From there, the review goes to the dean and possibly another committee before it is given to the Advisory Council, the provost and President Clark.

The professional school personnel committee would consist of seven members from professional school faculties—elected annually. The liberal arts personnel committee would consist of the Advisory Committee to the Dean of the College of Liberal Arts—elected by the faculty of the College.

Also to be considered is a motion to authorize the College of Business Administration to authorize a Ph.D degree.

S.U.A.W. collecting signatures

Students Union Against the War is collecting signatures for a request to Oregon news media asking them to stop calling members of the NLF and PRG in South Vietnam, the NVA, the Pathet Lao in Laos, and the National United Front in Cambodia as "enemy." The petition may be signed at the S.U.A.W. table at 10 a.m. today on the EMU terrace.

Demos lead in youth registration

Approximately 3 million 18-20 year-olds have registered to vote at a 2.7 to 1 Democratic rate, Robert Weiner, national youth registration coordinator for the Young Democrats office at the Democratic National Committee, announced today.

These are the results of a survey of secretaries of state and voter registration coordinators across the country conducted by the Young Democrats' national headquarters in Washington, D. C.

This total represents 27 per cent of 11.5 million eligible 18-21 year-olds with the presidential election coming up in more than 10 months. The total registered at this early time surprises many political analysts who had predicted that young persons would not register in large numbers.

Results were obtained from thirty-two states, as well as a breakdown of party registration for fourteen.

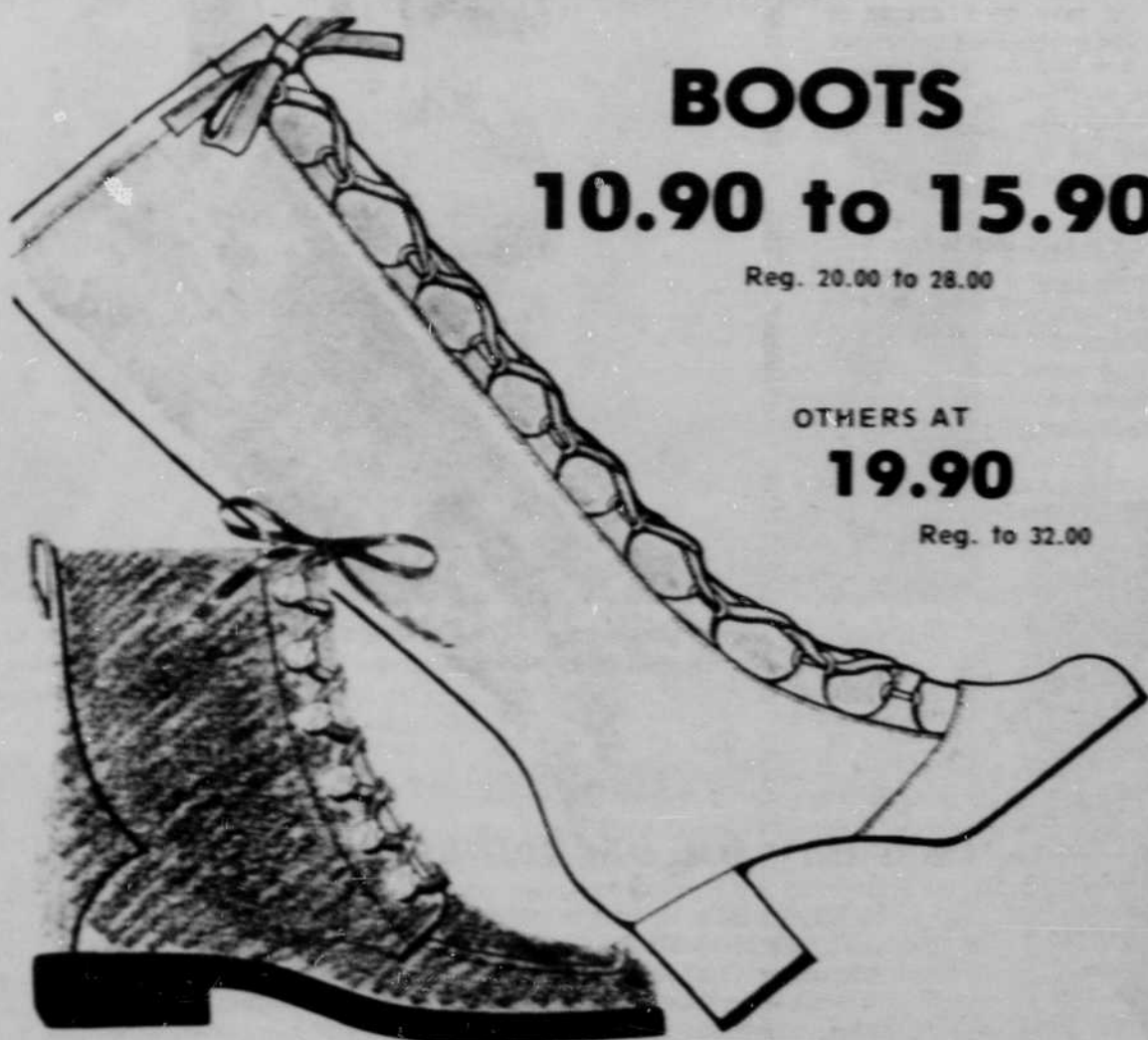
