Peace Corps cuts not anticipated

The U.S. Peace Corps, like other government agencies, is having budget problems this year, but Northwest Action representative Bill McCleary "sincerely anticipates" that no budget cuts will occur this year.

McCleary said last week, in response to questions from University students who have applied for the Peace Corps program in Eugene: "Congress wants to cut our present budget of \$2 million to the point that it would make operation at the present volunteer level impossible. If this cut occurs, certain volunteer cutbacks will be necessary."

"The vote on this comes to the floor of Congress the end of February and we won't know anything for sure until then. We sincerely anticipate, however, that our former budget will be approved, meaning no cut, therefore no program cutbacks."

McCleary said if cuts do occur, they will be in "Generalist" areas—liberal arts and families. He asked that all interested University seniors to consult Action representatives at the EMU Terrace this week to find out more about the status of their applications. About 50 students on campus have signed up so far, and McCleary expects 200 more students to sign up.

McMinnville band to perform

The McMinnville High School Stage Bands and Recorder Consort will perform at the University Music Recital Hall at 7:30 p.m. tonight.

The band, under the direction of John Dulaney, has received many honors, including a first place trophy at the Clark College Jazz Festival in 1970. They have performed with such noted band leaders as Don Ellis and Glenn Stuart. The band promotes student participation in all areas of performing. Some student compositions and arrangements will be part of tonight's program.

The McMinnville High School Recorder Consort is a student-initiated, student-run organization. Besides interpreting traditional works, the members also compose and arrange original music for the seven-piece group.

Selections of the McMinnville Consort will include recorder works by Handel, Dowland, and Susato. The band will play works by several contemporary stage band composers.

There is no admission charge for the concert.

Short circuit cause of power failure

Where were you when the lights went out?

You may have been one of the many people who missed morning classes Monday due to failure of alarm clocks or perhaps one who sat bewildered in the dimness of early morning light listening to a lecturer you couldn't see.

The apparent culprit of the 45-minute campus power failure was a short circuit in a primary underground power line between the Eugene Water and Electric Board (EWB) and the Physical Plant, says Leland Lorange, Assistant Director of the Physical Plant.

By shutting off EWB power to the University and running independently on Physical Plant power, electricity was reinstated by 9 a.m., said Lorange.

According to Physical Plant Director Harold Babcock all areas on campus except the boiler plant and some of the science areas with backup power were affected by the failure.

Stathos to receive Cycling Award

The author of Oregon's "bicycle bill" will receive national recognition today.

Rep. Don Stathos (R-Jacksonville) will be awarded the 1971 Annual Morse-American Youth Hostel Cycling Award this morning on the Portland State University campus.

Previous winners of the award include Sen. Gaylord Nelson, former Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall and Mayors John Lindsay and Joseph Alioto.

A panel of seven persons, nationally prominent in cycling, selected Stathos as the 1971 winner from nominees submitted by six national cycling associations.

American Youth Hostels Inc. is a non-profit association, organized to encourage people of all ages to enjoy the out-of-doors. It has a U.S. membership of 70,000 and operates 100 hostels nationally.

The 47-year old legislator will be presented a plaque for "introducing successful legislation considered to have the greatest beneficial effect upon cyclists and the sport of cycling."

McCall lauded for conservation

Gov. Tom McCall is to receive the American Scenic and Historic Preservation Society's 1971 "Medal of the Society" award for "his outstanding contribution in the field of conservation and preservation of our American heritage."
