If passed, the amendment would require the approval of Eugene voters before the city could build or enter into any contract calling for the construction of a freeway within the city limits.

The Peoples Planning Committee for Balanced Transportation will present the measure to the city Council, Monday, Jan. 24.

The petition must receive about 4500 signatures from registered Eugene voters.
