In addition to playing the demanding lead role of the working head of a lumbering family trying to deliver contracted timbers during a labor dispute, Newman also handles the directing chores. While he had previously directed his wife, Joanne Woodward, in "Rachel, Rachel" to great acclaim, he has never before acted under his own direction. The filming of complicated scenes working near to tons of falling trees required Newman's painstaking attention to every detail.

John Gay wrote the screenplay from the novel by Ken Kesey, and remained on the set making revisions during the entire production, to make the action fit better into the locations. This is a departure from the normal procedure where the script as written at the studio must be shot on location exactly as written whether the action fits or not.

Henry Fonda, who plays the patriarch of the lumbering family that stubbornly refuses to give in to the union, began his career 35 years ago. This is the first time he has portrayed a character his own age on the screen. Miss Remick, who portrays Newman's roving-eyed wife, was reunited with him on the screen for the first time since "The Long, Hot Summer." She was nominated for an Oscar for her work in "Days of Wine and Roses." Sarrazin, whose performance in "They Shoot Horses, Don't They?" made him one of Hollywood's most sought after new stars, plays Newman's half-brother who returns after a ten years' absence, only to find the family needs his help during the difficult time.



STRAW DOGS

A film of startling suspense and involvement wherein a young couple's idyllic life is disrupted, The ABC Pictures Corp. presentation was filmed on location in the west of England from a screenplay by Peckinpah and David Z. Goodman, based on a novel by Gordon M. Williams. Daniel Melnick was the producer. The music was by Jerry Fielding.

Hoffman plays the unusual role of a quiet young American who moves with his English wife portrayed by Susan George, to a farmhouse outside a seemingly peaceful Cornish village. Their placid life is interrupted when they discover that the savagery and violence they sought to escape is about to engulf them.

Sam Peckinpah, the highly respected and sometimes controversial director of *Straw Dogs*, has created a film which adds a new dimension to his highly acclaimed career. Considered a specialist in the American West, he has attracted the attention of a cinematic "cult" for his previous successes including "The Wild Bunch," "The Ballad of Cable Hogue" and "Ride the High Country."
