Faculty meeting to be held today

A proposal to seat students on two University personnel committees dealing with promotion and tenure will be debated at the general faculty meeting at 3:30 p.m. today in 150 Science.

The proposal, which has been endorsed by the ASUO Senate, will be introduced by Senate President Stephanie Larsen. It also has the endorsement of the Faculty Senate which voted 12 to 11 (with two abstentions) last Wednesday to recommend the bill to the full faculty.

The proposal seeks to place three students on the College of Liberal Arts Personnel Committee and three students on the Professional School Personnel Committee. These committees were created by the faculty Jan. 12 to aid the Advisory Council in investigation of promotion and tenure matters.
