Anti-war coalition to present demands

"Sights and Sounds of War," an anti-war coalition of various groups in Eugene, has planned to present three demands to University President Robert Clark today.

Coalition members will hold a rally at the EMU Terrace at noon today, and soon afterward will present the three demands to Clark, according to coalition member Carol Reich.

The three demands are:

—That "Clark shut down the University on May 4 in conjunction with a national moratorium to protest the intensified bombing of Indochina."

—That "Clark call a special faculty meeting to vote on the termination of ROTC and all military recruiters on the University campus."

—That "Clark refuse to make any of the budget cuts recommended by the Hearing Panel On University Priorities, a review panel assigned by Clark to trim \$1.5 million from the University's proposed budget for the fiscal year 1972-73. Such budget cuts are necessitated by massive military spending."

The coalition says "The three demands are seen as vital for ending U.S. military involvement in Indochina."

Ms. Reich said Sunday that "Sights and Sounds of War" is a recently formed coalition including members of the Student Union Against the War, the Vietnam Veterans Against the War, People for a Just University, and Peace Investors of Eugene.

She said the coalition has developed a schedule of activities for this week, Monday through Friday. (See schedule, this page.)

Events listed are tentative, and "at the end of each day, events will be assessed and plans for the next day will be determined," Ms. Reich said. She said events scheduled for today, Tuesday and Wednesday are "building action" for the student strike scheduled Thursday.

The coalition says, "The strike, to occur on the second anniversary of the Kent State killings, will follow three days of anti-war activities on the campus, including rallies, leafletting, guerrilla theatre, mock war activities, etc."

"The thrust of the week-long 'Sights and Sounds of War' is to involve students in community anti-war activities and to encourage support of peace candidates."

350 march against war in Portland

PORTLAND (SPECIAL) — About 350 persons marched through the streets bordering downtown Portland Saturday, in protest against the increased bombing of Vietnam by American forces.

The march was preceded by an all-night vigil held at the march's starting point, Women's Park, by the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom.

The march and rally Saturday were sponsored by the Student Mobilization Committee, and had the backing of several college student governments, including that of Portland State University.

The marchers wound their way up Main Street, and Broadway, to the park blocks at PSU. There they were met by a rock band and listened to speakers.

Phoebe Freidman, a write-in candidate for Third Congressional District, told the protestors, "We have to mobilize a People's Army to go out among the voters and into the streets and gain our government back."

The Saturday march started a week of activities in the Portland area which include a teach-in and possible "confrontation" with Atomic Energy Commission officials today and tomorrow at a Trojan Nuclear Power Plant hearing scheduled in Portland.

May 3 has been billed as "Abortion Action Day" on the PSU Park Blocks.



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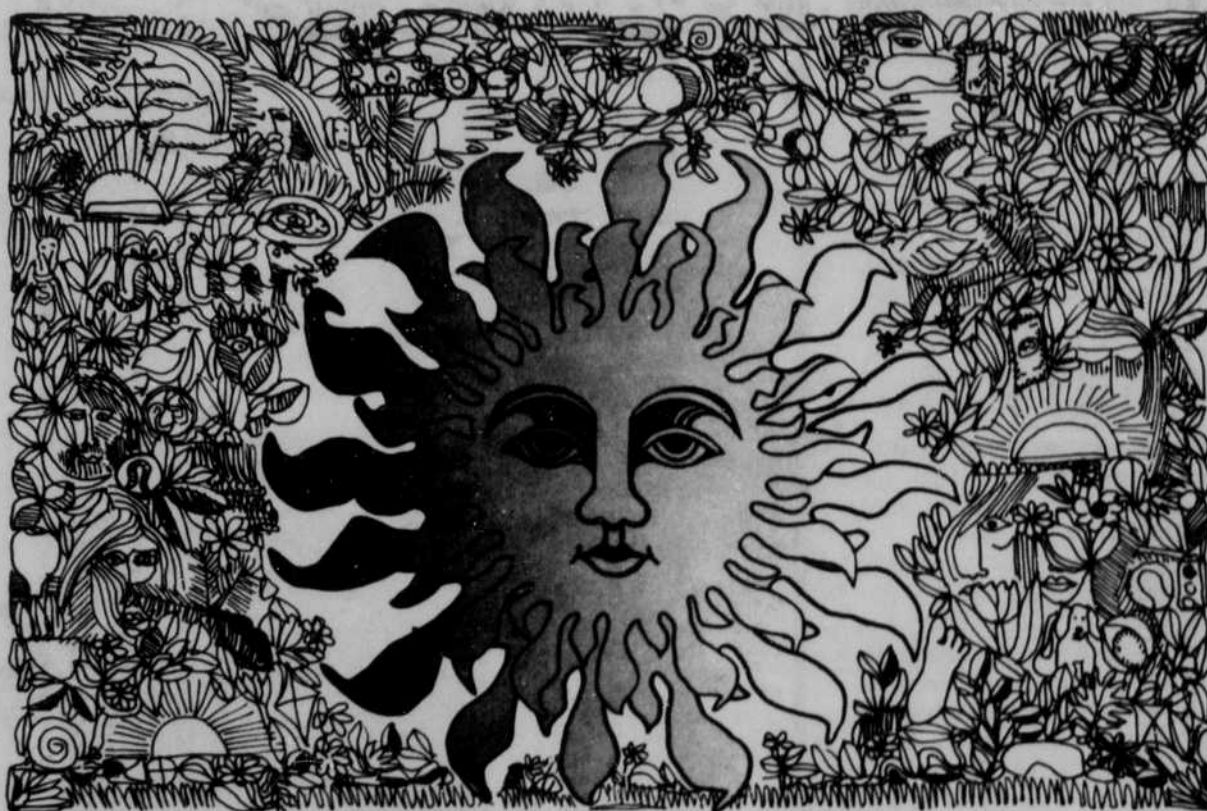
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
