Voters have second go at school budget

Today is voting day for patrons of School District 4J in Eugene. A proposed school budget of \$24.02 million is being voted on for the second time.

The proposed school budget is 8.8 per cent higher than last year's and is identical to the one voters turned down May 1 by a 1757-vote margin.

Of the proposed \$24.02 million, \$16.9 million is earmarked to come from property taxes. This represents an increase of 80 to 85 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation.

New funds which would be brought in by the tax increase will go to higher wages for teachers and staff, new employees, increases in fixed charges, a fund for the purchase of new school buses and money to finance additional field trips for district students and for differential staff.

Funding for travel and living expenses for a summer fellow must come from the sponsoring institution. Howard's travel and expenses are funded by the University's Development Fund.
