

Graduate announces candidacy

The Libertarian political party began its quest for the highest offices in the nation with Tonie Nathan's official announcement for the Vice-Presidency at a press conference in the Eugene Hotel Wednesday morning.

Nathan, 49, 1971 graduate of the University, television producer and reporter, was selected to run on the Libertarian party ticket with Presidential candidate John Hospers, head of the University of Southern California's philosophy department at the Libertarian party convention last month in Denver.

"I think there is a vast segment of society which is dismayed and repulsed by the current political scene," Nathan said. "I think they may be ready to support a party of integrity—a party of intellect and reason."

Nathan says the party expects to make an attempt to get on the ballot in Oregon. She believes the Libertarian Party has large support among the voters. "There are a large group of people acquainted with the ideas of the Libertarian Party, but have never had a political arena in which to express their ideas," she said.

As to actual numbers supporting the Libertarian Party, Nathan said there were 100 delegates at the party convention in Denver last month, with about 200 to 300 onlookers. Nationally, she said the party has over 1,000 members and is strong in California and New York.

The Libertarian party does not seriously challenge the two major political parties in voting strength in this election, Nathan said, they do, however, challenge the other parties' principles.

Both the Democratic and Republican parties, Nathan said, agree that man's duty is to serve the state, . . . and that the institution of legalized, governmental force is justifiable, necessary, and expedient." She refers to these principles at "statist."

In contrast, Nathan said, "the Libertarian Party recognizes that its programs must be based on moral principles which can be defended rationally."
