

World Black Unity topic of symposium

The Black Graduate Student Council of the University is presenting its first Symposium entitled "Pan-Africanism: A Way to World Black Unity" to be held on Thursday from 1 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the EMU.

The Symposium will consist of several speakers, poetry and reading and a panel discussion. The speakers and panel will include University black graduate students from Africa, the Caribbean and the United States.

Some of the topics to be covered will be:

- 1) The present problems faced by black people around the world
- 2) The causes of these problems
- 3) Possible solutions to the problems

The Black Graduate Student Council and Associates

(BGSC&A) is made up of graduate students of African descent at the University. Some of its major goals are to develop communication between all black students at the University and the improvement of the quality of education received by black students who are studying there.

Since Pan-Africanism is a subject of increasing interest to all black people, the BGSC&A is presenting this Symposium. Pan-Africanism embraces the total struggle for freedom and self-determination by African peoples everywhere. The Symposium will discuss how the present struggle for liberation is taking place in Angola and Mozambique, South Africa, Guinea Bissau and Zimbabwe and how it can be seen in the same light as the struggle in the Mississippi Delta.

The Symposium is free to all. Donations are welcomed. All moneys collected will be used in the development of the BGSC&A library. The BGSC&A is presently collecting all available books, booklets and magazines on the black experience anywhere in the world.

More delays possible in world chess match

REYKJAVIK, Iceland (AP) — World Champion Boris Spassky may again delay his postponed ninth chess title game against Bobby Fischer, buying time to tighten his grip on himself and on his title. If he doesn't, the Americans might.

"Boris might seek a second postponement," a friend said Monday, "He needs at least a week to pull himself together. He looks bad. He plays awful."

Spassky, trailing Fischer 5-3, postponed Sunday's ninth game because of a cold. His aides refused to confirm he would play Tuesday, as scheduled, but said he was feeling better.

The Americans left the door open for Fischer to postpone and further unsettle the Russian champion.

"Anything can happen here in Iceland, where the weather is so unpredictable," said Bill Lombardy, Fischer's second.

"We'll just have to hope Bobby will not have a cold."

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
