He might go to graduate school because of a lack of anything better to do, which he feels is a comment on the predicaments of many persons today.

"There are a lot of really dissatisfied people walking around right now and it's really tough to say why they're dissatisfied—if it's the fault of the University, of the state, of the nation or whatever, it's really tough to say—but for an awful lot of people there is simply nothing better to do than go to school. The unfortunate thing is that it costs money and it's sorta tough to make a living and a lot of people are finding that out now.

He likes Eugene—which is "just generally sort of a good place for me, I like it except for the weather (because) hay fever really kills me"—and he's glad he came to the University—"There's an awful lot that can be done here at the University that satisfies the interests of an awful lot of people, different sorts of people."

His other interests include photography (he once had a dark room in his apartment kitchen), camping, fishing, both water and snow skiing, hockey ("I'm actually sort of a semi-jock"), and travelling.

Wyatt says he has a "really good relationship" with his father, whose political activities undoubtedly influenced his life.

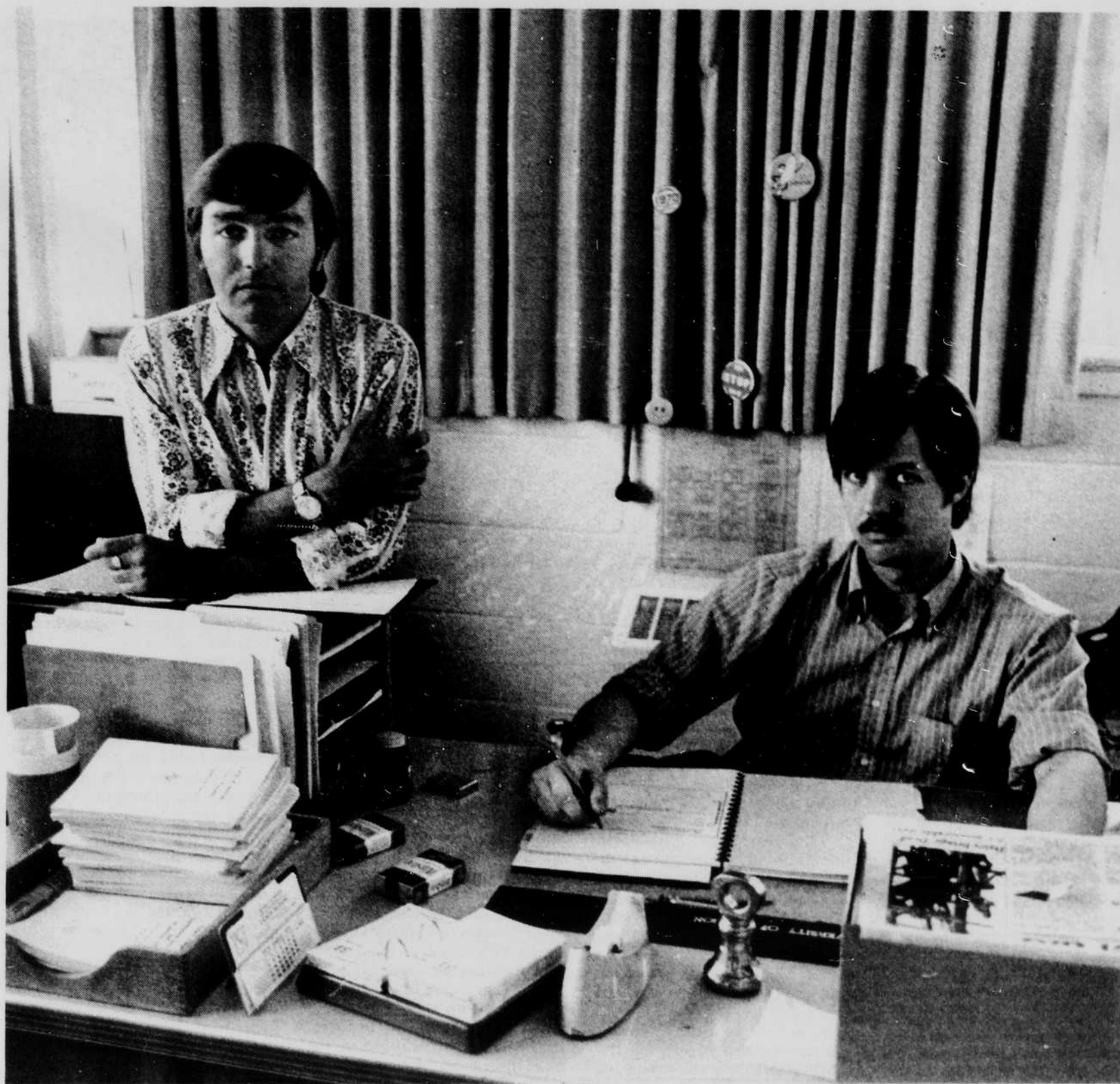
He went to Washington, D.C., with his father his freshman year of high school in 1964 (his parents are divorced), returned to stay with some friends his sophomore year and went back to Washington schools his junior and senior years.

"Being the son of a congressman in Washington, D.C., has its advantages," he says, "in terms of things to do and things to see, (such as) special White House tours and to actually see some things, like sitting on the floor of Congress when they were enacting business. It was a pretty exciting thing, really, not too many people get to do that."

Wyatt also enjoyed sitting in his father's office—"watching him transact business or create legislation or 'move with the people.' It was really pretty interesting."

So Bill Wyatt is sorta happy with the way things are going for him right now. He's sorta going to the University, sorta majoring in political science, sorta going to graduate some day and sorta may go into politics, because his father says it's the only alternative if you're not qualified for anything else.

But Bill Wyatt is definitely going to finish out his term as ASUO president. He'll worry about everything else when the time comes.

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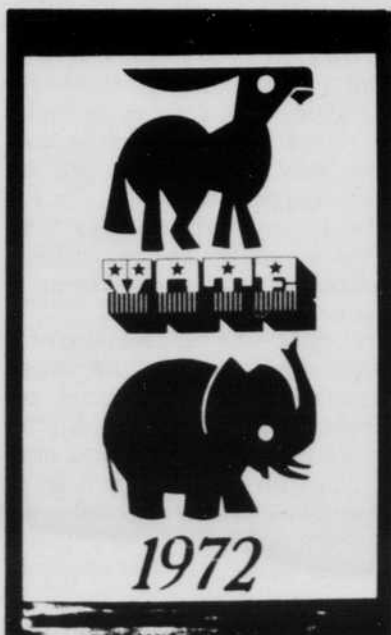


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
