FSO board to meet

The Foreign Student Organization (FSO) executive board will meet for the fourth time in 20 days at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday to discuss a proposed new constitution.

The proposed constitution, written by Fred Loveys, will replace the present FSO constitution if approved by the FSO. Although he does not fully support the proposed constitution, Ranjan Ray, executive board chair, believes it would be easier to use a new constitution than to amend the old constitution.

At the last meeting of the board Friday, Ray told the FSO board ASUO officials told him the FSO budget would probably be unfrozen when the board sends the ASUO a letter requesting the unfreezing of the budget and agrees to pay off a loan by the Chinese Student Association.

Loveys also told the meeting the FSO board would probably have to accept spending guidelines set down by the ASUO in an August 11, 1972, letter to former FSO President Davoud Davoudi.
