The MBA Association is composed of all graduate business students for the Masters degree, and is spokesman for MBA students to the Graduate Student Council, the faculty and to various committees on campus.

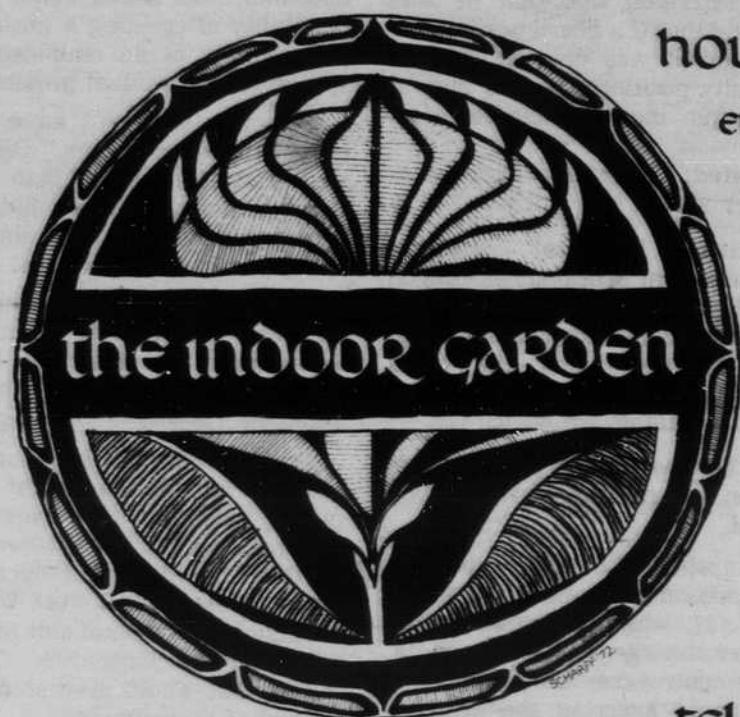
