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summer as those taking 12 to 21 credit hours, and full-time graduates as those taking nine to 16 credit hours.

The report also indicated that total summer tuition and fee rates for 1972-73 were set at the level charged for spring term of that year.

According to the report, distribution rates for summer differed from the academic year in accommodating the differences in programs and the use of resident tuition rates for all summer students.

The staff recommendation of setting the University's undergraduate summer session fee at \$169.50 and the graduate fee at \$251.50 will be considered at the committee's public hearings.

The recommendation that rental rates for married student housing be determined by the institution and then approved by the state system chancellor was also passed at the committee meeting Wednesday.

Edward Westerdahl, finance committee member, said, "I don't feel we are properly equipped to determine dorm rates here. I feel that the institution can more adequately adjust the specifics than we can."

Elizabeth Johnson, chairer of the board's Academic Affairs Committee, suggested that married students have been enjoying a financial subsidy for years and ought to help with the higher costs that other students have with dormitory housing.

University President Robert Clark disagreed with Johnson, saying that married students should not have to help to subsidize others. Clark said he was quite sympathetic toward their needs and a more justified understanding of them has not been given.

The approved staff recommendation also stated that rental rates will be established after a public hearing at each institution.

Institutional student financing was delayed for discussion by the committee until Wednesday, March 7.

and conduct legislative business of the present senate, and also investigate the possibilities of student-faculty government, vote "yes" on constitutional measure "D" and "no" on measure "A".

The basic difference between the two proposals is the existence of a legislative body in "D" and a body whose sole responsibility is incidental fee allocation in "A". The ballot description of measure "D" fails to mention that the new

constitution would substitute the 24-member assembly for the present senate.

If you want to keep the senate as it is, vote "no" on both "A" and "D".
