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General catalog to be published

The University, which has not published a general catalog for two years because of budget problems, will have a new catalog by July 1.

The catalog will have several new features, including a new format, but for the first time in the University's history, students will have to pay for individual copies. The cost will be \$1 per copy.

The 1973-74 catalog is expected

to save money by having self-contained sections for departments, so that the departments can order reprints of their own sections to distribute free to students and prospective students, thus eliminating a need for most separate informational publications.

Furthermore, the Graduate School catalog, formerly published separately, now will be included in the general catalog.

The catalog will look different, too. It is changing from Reader's Digest (5½ x 7½) to Time size (8½ x 11) because, according to Mitchell, "the new size lends itself to more versatile design possibilities and more effective communication." He notes, for instance, that the catalog will contain photographs and graphic illustrations for the first time.

On campus, the catalog may be purchased at the U of O Co-op book store. Mail-order copies will cost \$1.25.

The Saffells come west with an impressive background in environmental experience. Marion served as editor of the "Conservation Crusade," an Audubon publication, and has served with various conservation organizations.

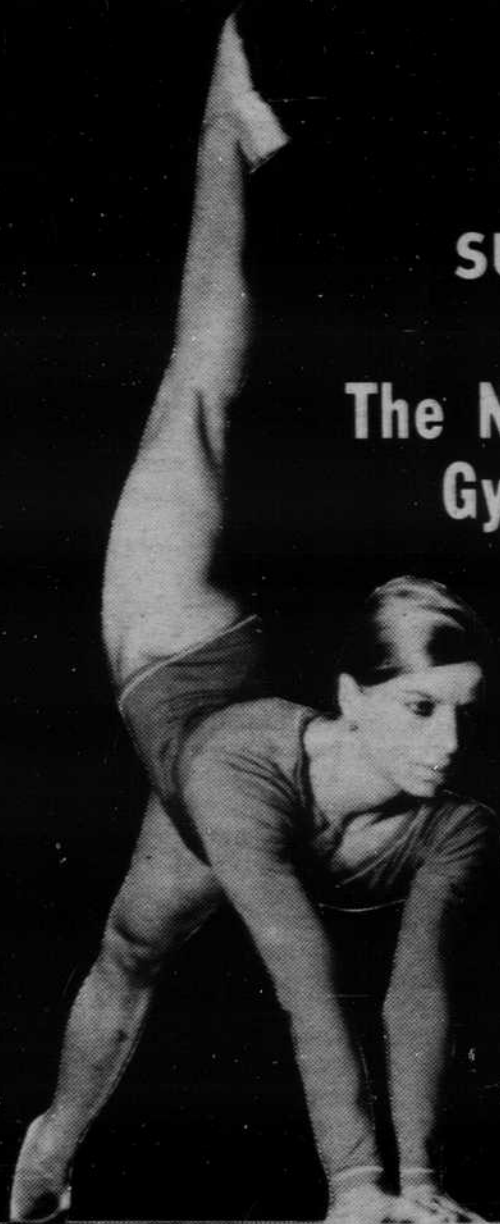
Dr. Saffell is a medical doctor now living in Oakridge.
